- The writing competition is open to all Senior Card Holders in New South Wales. Seniors Card number is **COMPULSORY** on the entry form. (No replacement number).
- 2. Entry is free.
- 3. The theme for 2020 is 'RESILIENCE'.
- 4. Title MUST be unique. PLEASE DO NOT USE THEME AS THE TITLE.
- 5. Story length **STRICTLY** maximum 1,000 words. **Above will be disqualified.**
- 6. Closing date is 12 noon March 30th, and no entries will be accepted after that time.
- 7. The top 100 entries will be published in the Seniors Card Anthology to be released by the Department of Communities and Justice in October/ November 2020.
- 8. The judge's decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 9. Entry Forms will be available on the FAW website www.fawnsw.org.au from February 1st, 2020. The forms are interactive, and the entry can be attached.
- 10. Assistance for typewriter prepared or hand-written entries, please phone 0417 403 720 to discuss your entry submission.
- 11. Entries must only be in a Microsoft word document. Entries sent in other than word will not be accepted.
- 12. Entries should be double spaced and 'Footer' to include **title** and **page number**. *Name should only appear on the entry form.*
- 13. Multiple entries may be entered, but only one story per writer will be selected.
- 14. Do not enter the same story again without contacting the below.
